Partial Superior Court Closure - Extension

The judges of the Superior Court of California, County of Shasta have secured an extension of the March 23, 2020 emergency order from the Chief Justice of the California Supreme Court authorizing reduced court operations to ensure public health and safety in compliance with Governor Gavin Newsom's Executive Order N-33-20.

The following courtrooms and services remain partially open/closed through Monday, May 4, 2020:

All felony cases will be heard in Departments 1 and 2 in the Justice Center. Any in-custody misdemeanor cases will also be heard in Departments 1 and 2, instead of Departments 9 and 10. Felony preliminary hearings where time is not waived will take place. Counsel are encouraged to utilize 977 waivers where allowable by law.

Civil matters heard in Departments 3 and 8 will be heard only on an emergency/urgent basis. For all future matters, please check the courts website, <a href="https://www.shasta.courts.ca.gov">www.shasta.courts.ca.gov</a>, for specific information. Also posted on the court's website, Administrative Order 13-2020, remains in full force and effect.

The family law calendars (Departments 4, 5, 11 and 12) will limit appearances to essential or emergency matters. Please see Family Court Procedures for Family Law Matters also posted on the front of the courthouse and on the court's website. Please see Administrative Order #18-2020 for more specific information. New

matters set on calendar will include only urgent appearances and ex parte hearings including civil and family law temporary restraining orders.

Department 6 will not be hearing any traffic cases, including red light camera trials. All dates set for traffic arraignments and traffic trials are canceled. All cases remain pending. Litigants should contact the court after reopening if they would like their case re-calendared.

All Small Claims matters are being continued. Parties will receive notice of their new date by mail or email.

The Probate department will hear only emergency petitions and ex parte hearings on Probate and non-LPS conservatorship matters until the court reopens. All other matters will be rescheduled.

Department 9 will hear only mental health capacity hearings, LPS writs of habeas corpus and juvenile delinquency in-custody detention and jurisdictional hearings.

Department 12 will hear only juvenile dependency detentions, urgent jurisdictional hearings, and emergency guardianship petitions.

The misdemeanor calendars (excluding defendants in custody) normally heard in **Departments 9 and 10** will not be heard. Anyone having a court appearance in one of those courtrooms is continued eight weeks as indicated below:
